

Who We Are







Established in 2012, the **Equality Fund** at the Boston Foundation works to advance the equitable treatment of Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, and Queer (LGBTQ+) individuals and their families and support Greater Boston nonprofit organizations that serve and strengthen the LGBTQ+ community. The Fund is committed to investing in research, public forums and convenings, strategic partnerships, and grantmaking to nonprofit organizations that provide critical services to our diverse LGBTQ+ community.

The Equality Fund's priorities are guided by an Advisory Committee of community members and allies who possess a depth and breadth of understanding about the most pressing issues affecting LGBTQ+ people today. The Equality Fund is the first and largest philanthropic fund exclusively dedicated to supporting the LGBTQ+ community in Massachusetts.

In 2024, we find ourselves in a new era of partnership and with a fierce sense of urgency to ensure allmembers of our diverse LGBTQ+ community progress toward liberation. This year we are launching a campaign to raise \$15m by the Equality Fund's 15th anniversary in 2027. With \$9.5m committed to date, our goal is to ensure that the Equality Fund becomes a permanent, endowed resource to support the evolving needs of the LGBTQ+ community and equity for all.

Impact Summative Highlights From 2012-to-2024 Include:



Over \$2.2m in grants to 99 non-profit organizations in service to LGBTQ+ youth, aging adults, immigrant and asylum seekers, the transgender community, and in areas for civil rights to health care access, from the arts to education and more.



First-of-its-kind research on the LGBTQ+ community, serving as a call to action for policy-makers, public leaders, and non-profit organizations; and a catalyst for additional investments on behalf of LGBTQ+ individuals and families.



By community and for community, **140 donors have contributed \$3m** to the Equality Fund to date, and another seven donors have made the Equality Fund a priority in their estate planning with **future anticipated gifts of \$6.5m**.
