






Land Acknowledgement

The Boston Foundation respectfully acknowledges the sacred land on which we work and convene, belonging to the Massachusetts, Wampanoag, and Nipmuck peoples. As the original stewards of these grounds, they lived with great respect for the land and each other generations before the onslaught of colonization, assimilation, genocide, and forced removal. We honor the rich culture and vast influence of all Native peoples, which has endured and withstood centuries of attempted cultural erasure. We recognize the Indigenous people who inhabited this land before colonization, who live here today, and all future generations.

At TBF, where equity is at the center of our work, it is our commitment to recognize and celebrate the past, present, and future contributions of Native people and how we, as a foundation, can listen to and uplift Native voices and communities, educate others about the injustices that have harmed Indigenous peoples, learn the true history of Boston's Natives, embrace their culture, advance equity and restorative justice, and foster respect for all Native Americans in Boston and beyond.





Baseline Eligibility

- 1. Aligns with our new Pathway
- 2. 501(c)(3) tax-exempt nonprofit or operates under a fiscal sponsorship of a tax-exempt nonprofit
- 3. Has not applied in the last 12 months
- 4. **Primarily serves people in the foundation's catchment area** apart from regional, statewide, or national public policy efforts where there is a strong connection with and influence on the Greater Boston policy interests
- 5. Responds to an essential need by providing resources that promote health, wellness, safety, and belonging for individuals or families in crisis
- 6. Has been operating for at least three years
- 7. Engages in **year-round programming**

Essential Needs

Essential needs are defined as resources that restore health, wellness, safety and belonging for individuals or families in crisis. They can include, but are not limited to:






- Childcare assistance
- Direct cash assistance
- Disability assistance
- Food security
- Health care access
- Legal support
- Mental health support
- Rental and housing assistance
- Support for survivors of trauma

Catchment Area

Apart from regional, statewide or national public policy efforts when there is a strong connection with and influence on Greater Boston policy interests.

Funding Priorities

We are especially interested in organizations that are:

- Smaller and have been historically excluded from philanthropic support;
- **BIPOC-led** and/or whose leadership reflects the demographic composition and lived experiences of the communities they serve;
- Meeting the needs of seniors and people with physical disabilities;
- Providing food, fuel and shelter support



BIPOC-Led Organizations

Organizations whose mission statement and/or programs aim to serve predominantly BIPOC communities and having one or more of the following:

- Executive Director or Senior Leadership (decision makers) identifies as BIPOC
- At least 51% of the board of directors identifies as BIPOC



BIPOC-Staffed Organizations

Organizations whose mission statement and/or programs aim to serve predominantly BIPOC communities and having one or more of the following:

 At least 51% non-senior leadership staff and volunteers identifies as BIPOC



Funding Considerations

Organizational Strength

- Aligns with Our New Pathway, the strategic vision for The Boston Foundation
- Clear mission and vision that guide the organization
- Strong staff and board leadership, that is diverse and representative (demographic composition and lived experience) of the community they serve
- Deep commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion (internally and externally)
- Strong emphasis on incorporating learnings from a measurement/assessment plan
- Strong collaboration/partnerships with community and communitybased organizations



Funding Considerations

Proposal's Potential for Impact

- The grant size will have a meaningful impact on the organization's effectiveness and ability to meet its mission
- Authentically serves populations and communities historically excluded from institutions and/or systems
- Clear correlation between annual goals and organization's ability to address the defined challenge or opportunity unfolding in their community
- Clear vision of success and a way to measure success on a scale that is appropriate to its learning goals and relative to its resources



Exclusions

We do NOT make grants for:

- Capital construction costs
- Endowments
- Medical or academic research
- Scholarships
- Individual persons
- Sectarian or religious purposes
- To support candidates for political offices
- Private non-operating foundations, 501(c)(4) organizations, and Section 501(a)(3) Type III Non-functionally Integrated organizations
- Parent Teacher Associations and tuition-based schools (including K-12 and postsecondary schools and universities)
- CDCs certified under Certified under MGL Chapter 40H, small businesses, LLCs

General Application Tips

200-400 words

per response

Long-term goals

Doesn't have to be within 2-year grant period

Bullet point responses

can help with more concise wording

Read aloud

Having your narrative read aloud can help with editing responses

Short-term goals

Next few weeks or months

Log in a few days before deadline

in case of technical difficulties







