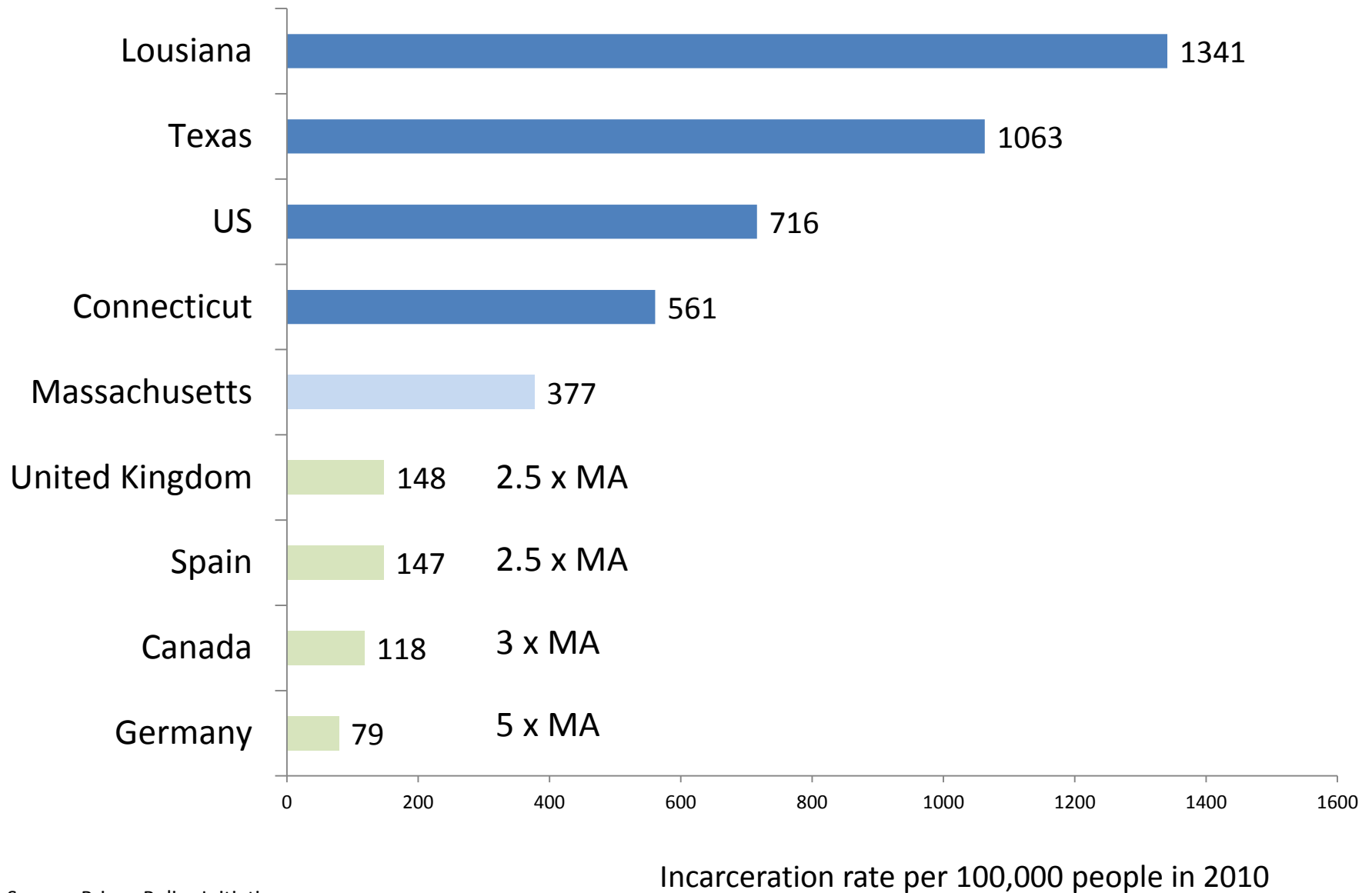
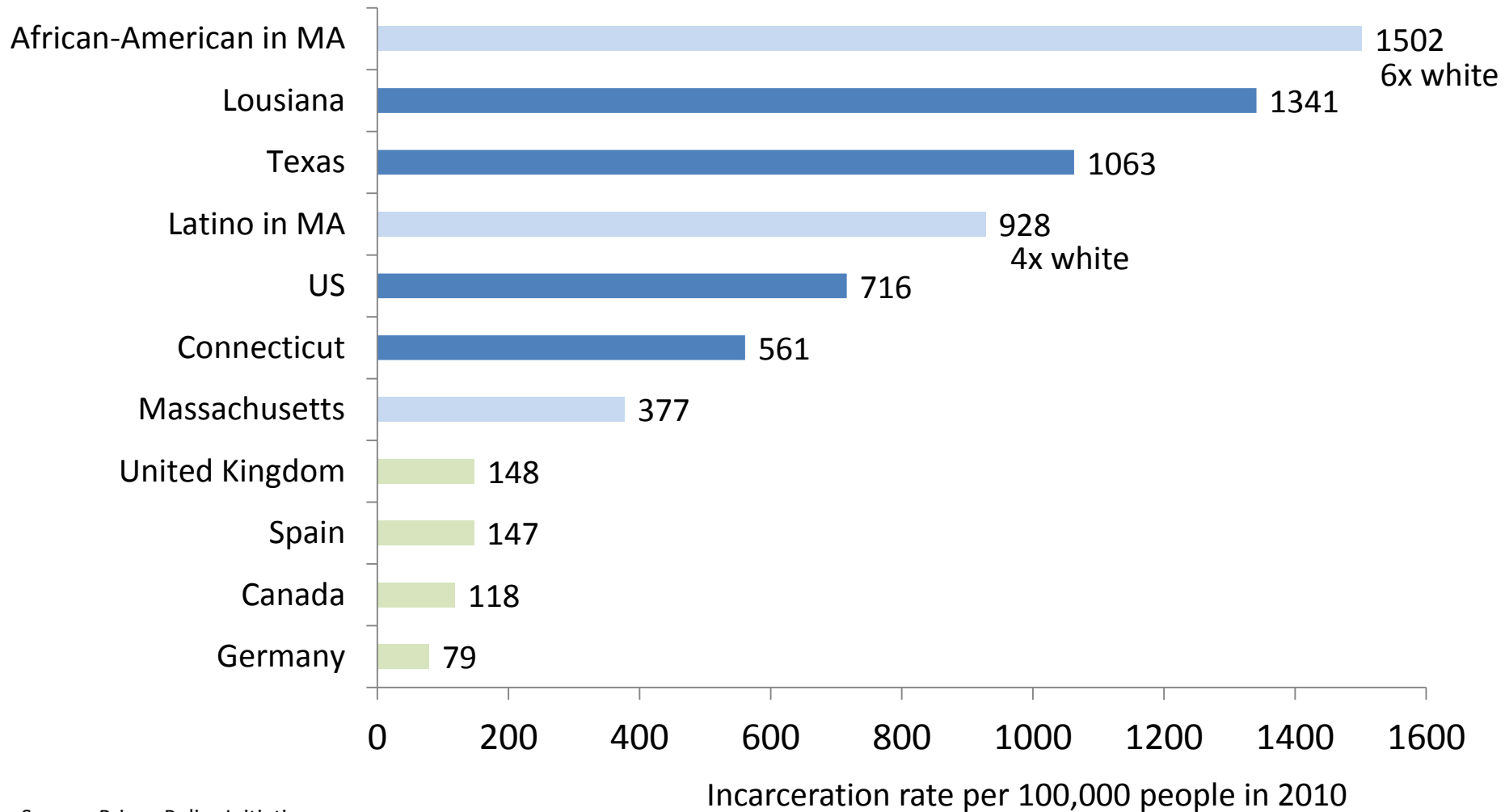


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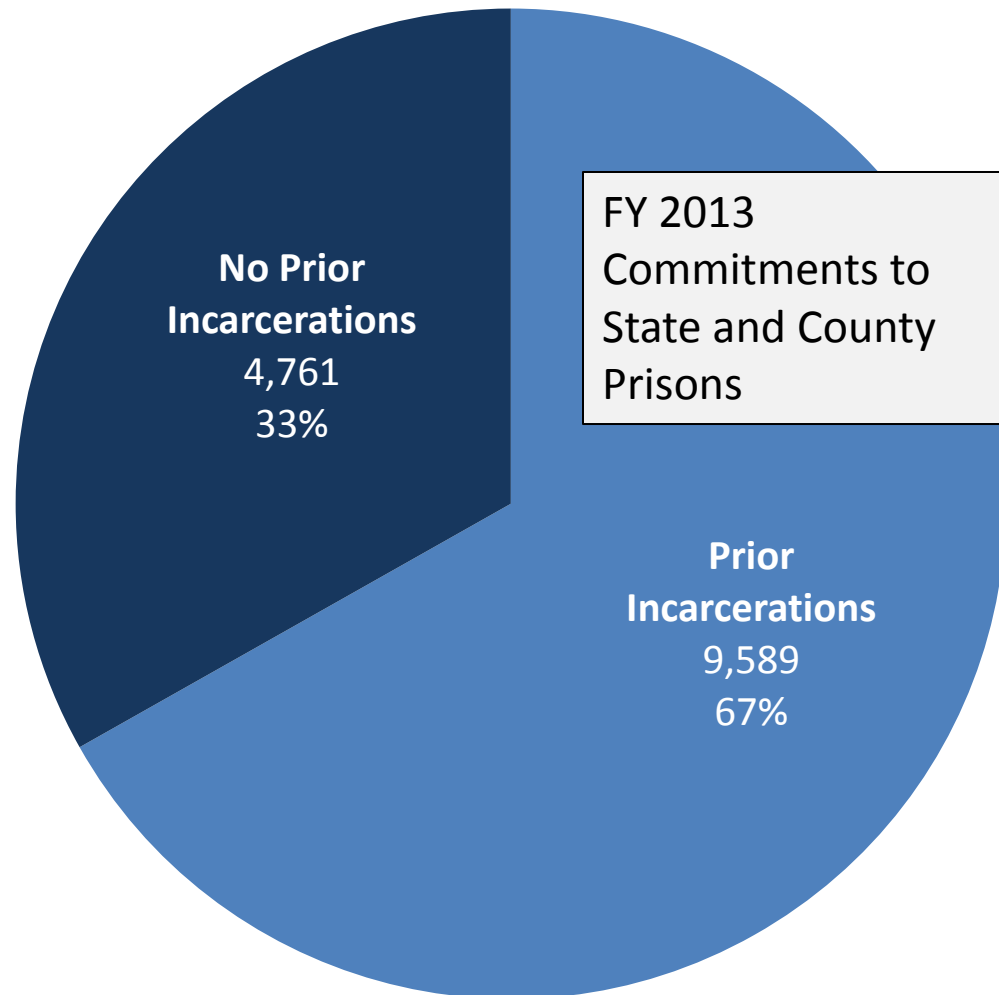
Incarceration rates are elevated



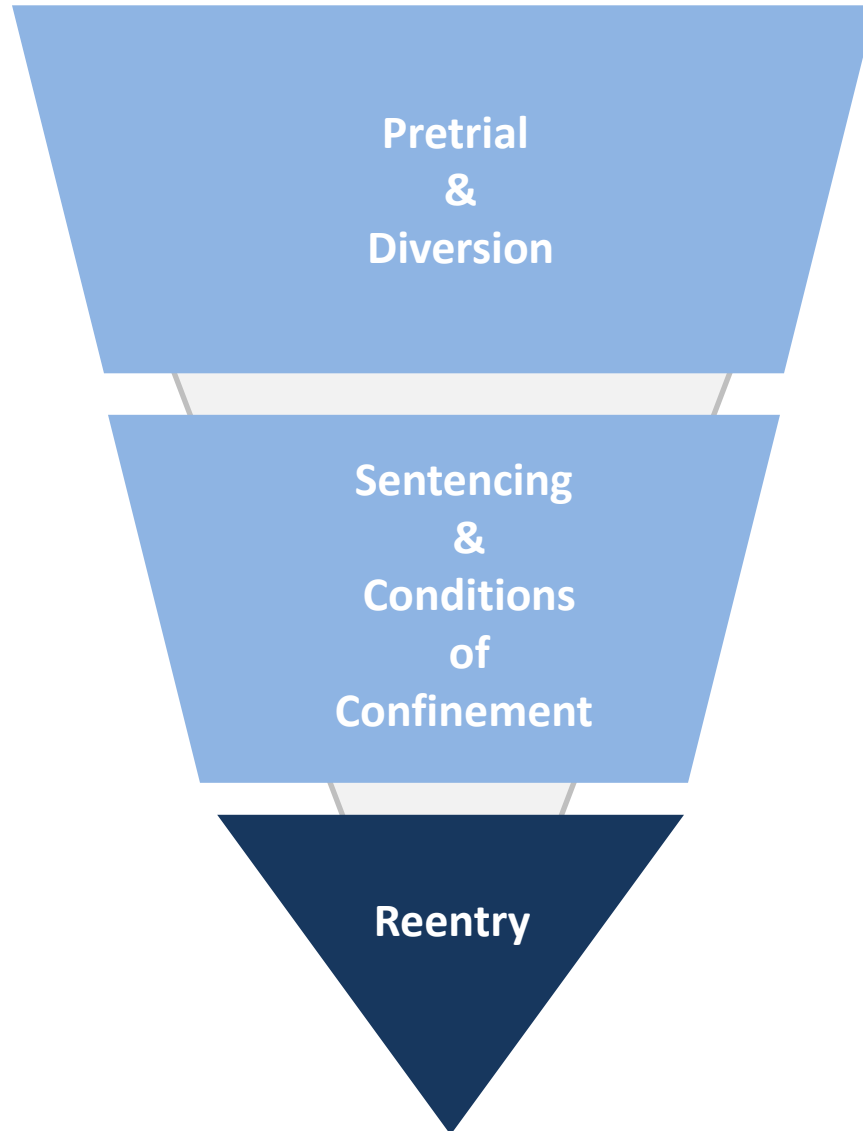
Communities of color are disparately impacted



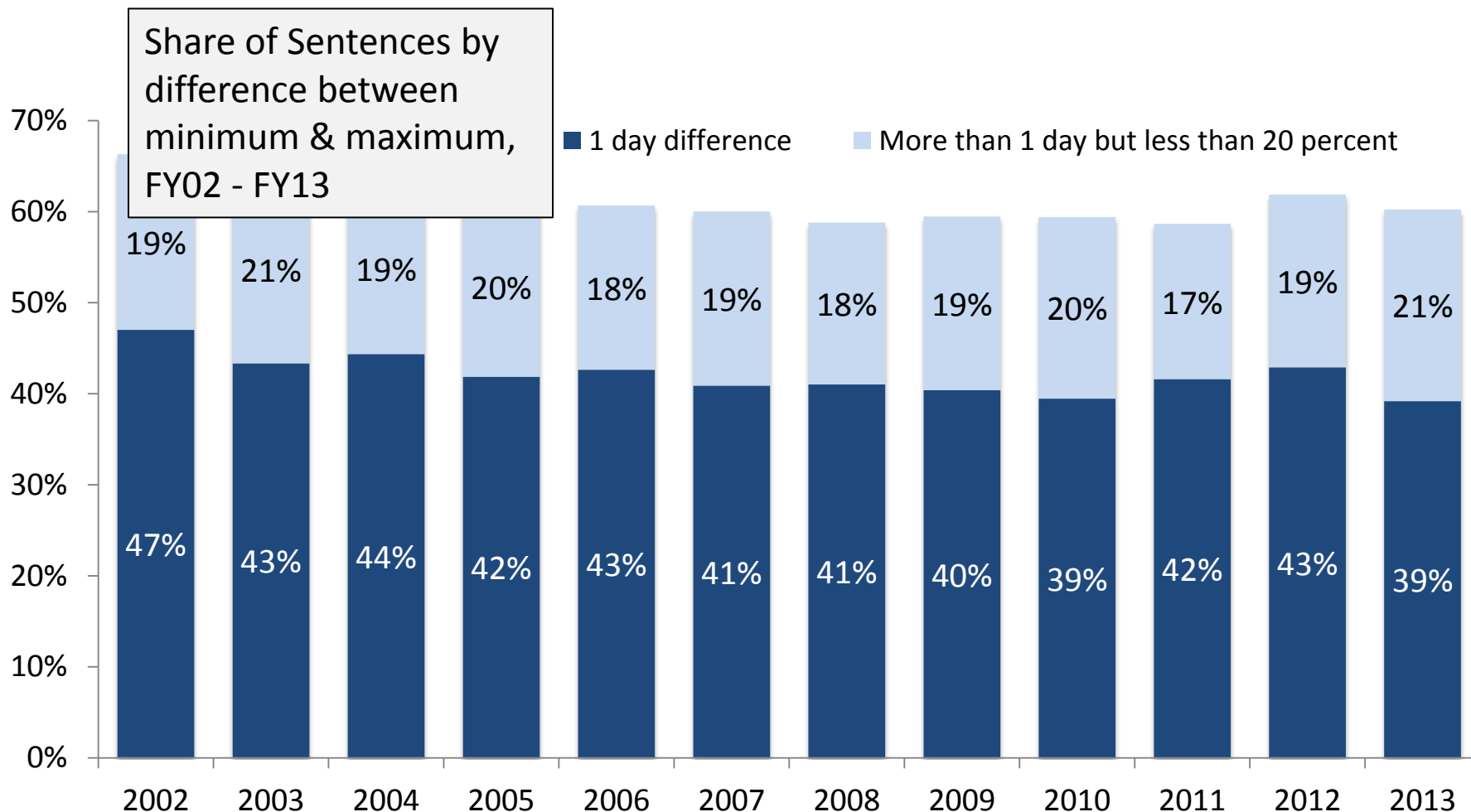
Repeat offending is a major public safety concern



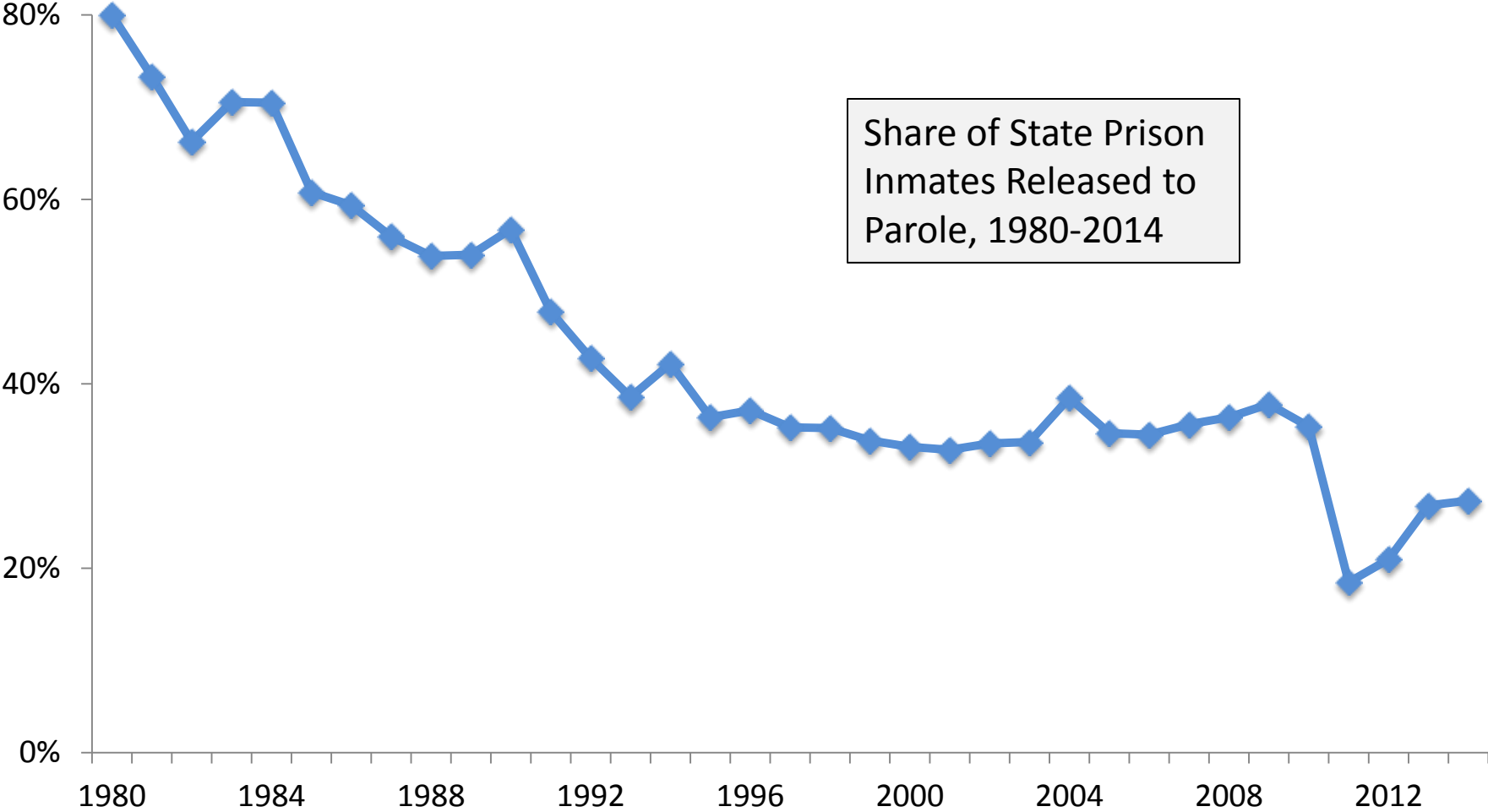
A comprehensive solution is required



Sentencing practices limit parole eligibility and incentive to earn parole

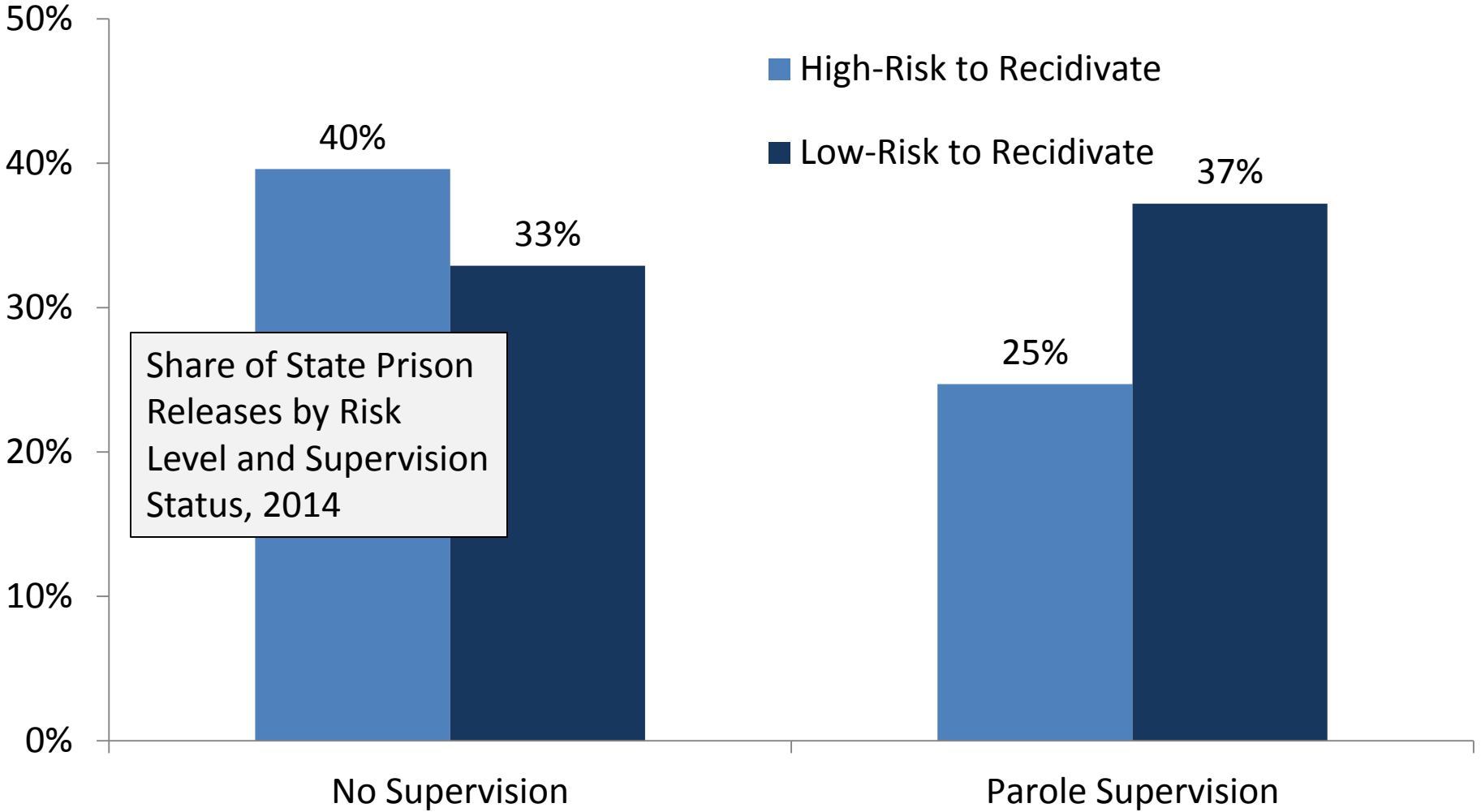


Release to parole supervision remains near historic low



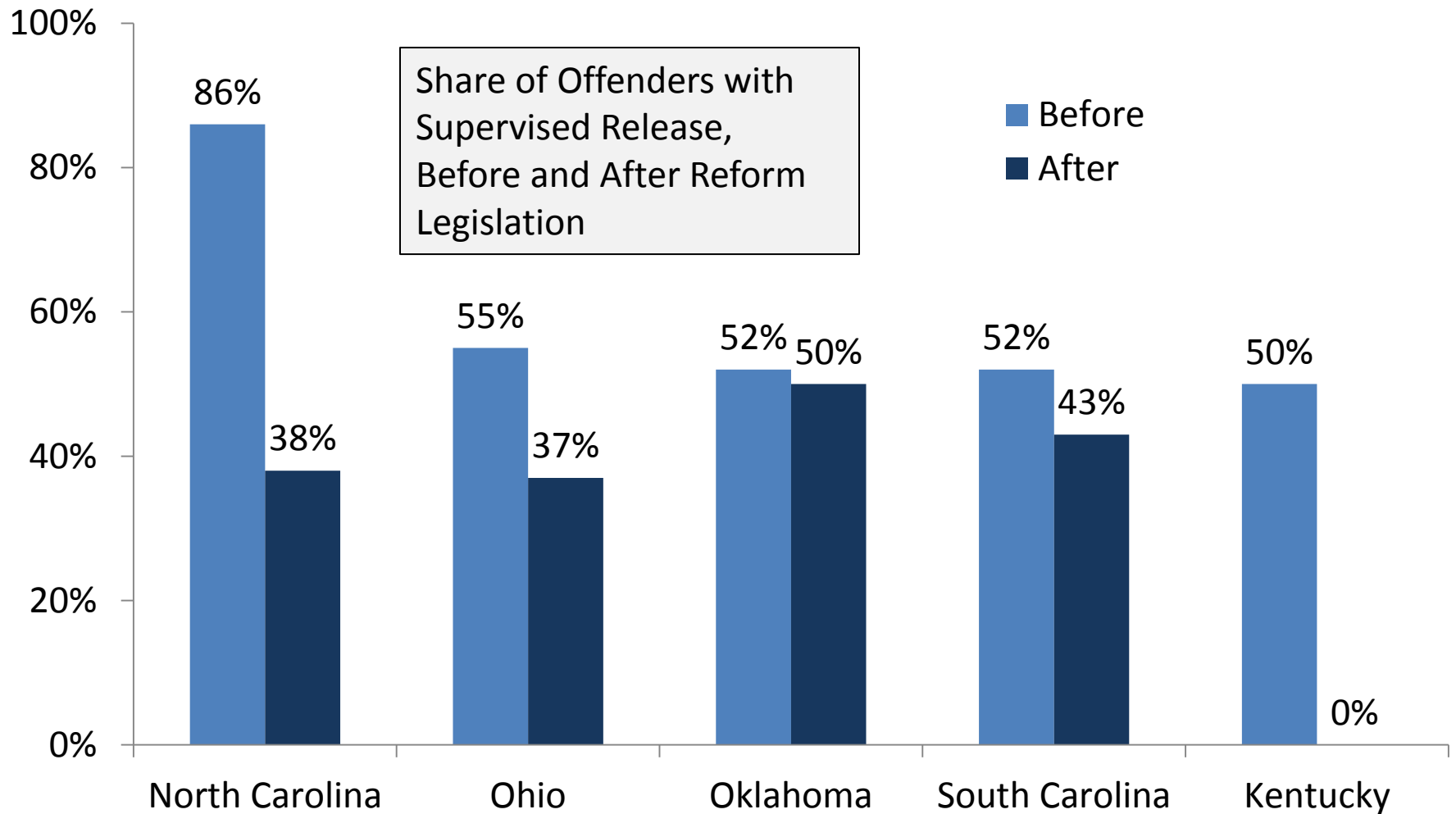

Other states are improving supervision



Statewide reentry initiatives have successfully reduced recidivism

Minnesota Comprehensive Offender Reentry Plan (2008)



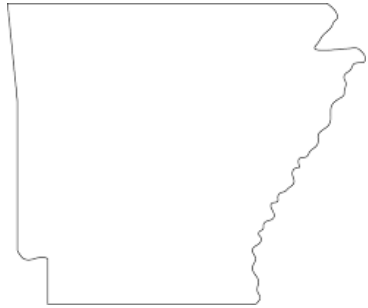
- Reentry planning and casework
- Reduced parole caseloads
- Increased community-based employment
- *Higher employment, lower homelessness, more program participation*
- *Re-arrest, re-conviction, and re-incarceration down 25%*

Michigan Prisoner Reentry Initiative (2005)



- Reentry planning and casework
- Increased programming and treatment
- Pre-release transfer to facility closest to community
- Release to parole supervision
- Return to prison fell 38 percent between 2005 & 2011

Only a handful of states are reinvesting in reentry



Arkansas

- Established Best Practices fund with \$2.4 million in supervision fees and \$4.3 million general appropriation
- Improved supervision, increased access to treatment, transitional housing



South Dakota

- \$8 million reinvestment of projected savings in 2014
- Improved supervision, increased funding for transitional housing, invested in training for parole officers

States are replicating our pay-for-success funding model



- Recidivism Reduction Fund in 2013
- \$5 million RFP for pay-for-success recidivism contracts

California



- \$13.5 million pay-for-success recidivism contract
- Serving 2,000 ex-offenders through the Center for Employment Opportunities

New York



- Passed pay-for-success legislation in 2014
- Issued RFP for reentry programs last August
